THEATER AND MUSEUM DISTRICT WALKING TOUR

1. Info New Haven

- Starting point for further exploration of New Haven.
- Maps, brochures, parking vouchers and gifts.
- Open 7 days a week; weekdays 10 am to 9 pm, Friday and Saturday 10 am to 10 pm, and Sunday 12 pm to 5 pm.



2. White Space Gallery

- Features hand signed lithographs from surrealist masters, including Dali, Picasso, Chigall and Miro.
- Also includes sculpture, local and international art. New displays monthly.
- Prices range from \$50 to \$25,000. Hours are 10 am to 6 pm, Monday through Saturday.



3. Union League Cafe

- This restaurant features innovative French and contemporary American cuisine, served in a unique architectural setting featuring marble columns, ornate ceilings and wood paneling.
- Prices range from \$35 to \$65 per person. Open every day except Sunday.



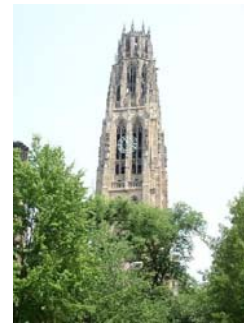
4. Skull and Bones

- The most famous of Yale's secret societies and one of the oldest in the country
- Members include US presidents, Supreme Court justices, and prominent business leaders
- Both major party nominees in the 2004 presidential election were Bonesmen



5. Harkness Tower and Old Campus

- Built between 1917 and 1921 from a gift by Anna M. Harkness in memory of her son Charles William Harkness, Yale Class of 1883
- Designed by James Gamble Rogers, Yale Class of 1889, it is 216 feet tall and contains sculptures by Lee Lawrie
- Houses the Yale Memorial Carillon, which has 54 bells and weighs 43 tons



6. Arts & Architecture Building

- Completed in 1963, it was designed by Paul Rudolph
- Considered one the most notable examples of Brutalist architecture in the country
- Exhibitions are displayed inside throughout the academic year



7. Yale Art Gallery

- Founded in 1832, it is the oldest college art museum in the country
- Contains a collection of over 185,000 pieces
- Main building was designed by Louis Kahn; completed in 1953, it was his first major commission



8. Yale Repertory Theatre

- Founded in 1966 by Robert Brustein, it has produced almost 100 world and American premieres
- 10 Yale Rep productions have gone on to Broadway, have garnered close to 40 Tony nominations, and won 8 Tony awards
- Won the 1991 Tony for Outstanding Regional Theatre



9. Yale Center for British Art

- Created by a gift from Paul Mellon, Yale Class of 1929, it is the largest collection of British art outside the United Kingdom
- It is the last building designed by Louis Kahn, completed in 1977, three years after his death
- Won the 2005 Twenty-Five Year Award from the American Institute of Architects

10. Louis Lunch

- The birthplace of the hamburger!
- Owned and operated by the Lassen family since 1895.
- Ketchup is neither provided nor needed.
- The current building was originally a tannery.
- Open every day except Sunday and Monday.



11. Shubert Theater

- Home to more pre-Broadway tryouts than any other east coast city.
- This 1,600 seat theater opened in 1914 and has been restored to its original colors.
